Soldier of the Month: TEC5 Charles Chibitty (Nov 20, 1921 - Jul 20, 2005) was a member of the Comanche Nation and a code talker for the 6th Signal Company of the 22nd Infantry Regiment, 4th Infantry Division. A resident of Oklahoma, Chibitty trained with the 4th at Camp Gordon Johnston, landed at Utah Beach on Jun 6, 1944, and fought in the Battle of the Bulge and the Batlle of Hürtgen Forest. Native Americans served in WWII in greater percentages than any other ethnic group. We honor them throughout the month of November.

Artifact of the Month: Do you know our phonetic alphabet used by the military? GOLF, ROMEO, ECHO, ALPHA, TANGO! In our collection of German items, we have a field radio with headset. Attached to the top of the cover is Germany's version of this phonetic alphabet. So "NEIN" in German (no) would be NORDPOL ERTHA DA NORDPOL!



This month's Exhibit: Native Americans in WWII will be open from Oct 31 to Nov 25

Native Americans form many tribal nations served in the military in WWII. The Code talkers are the most famous, and this program began in WWI with a team of Comanche members.
