Serviceman of the Month: Col. Ralph P. Jenkins of Seattle WA May 14, 1919- May 10, 2017 Jenkins trained at Dale Mabry Field in Tallahassee. His first duty was flight commander, a position he held when the 405th Fighter Group arrived in England to serve in the European Theater. Ralph then became squadron commander, remaining in that position until war's end. He flew a total of 129 missions. A RC model of his P47-D fighter plane, the "Tallahassee Lassie", is on display at the Museum.

Artifact of the Month: Commemorative Plate After the December 7, 1941, bombing of the military base at Pearl Harbor, Americans rallied around the war effort with the patriotic cry, "Remember Pearl Harbor." Thousands of buttons or lapel pins were distributed

to remind Americans of the tragic event and to

solidify the war efforts. (Smithsonian)
