Serviceman of the Month: PVT Pedro Cano of Edinberg TX (June 19, 1920 - Jun 24, 1952) was born in Nuevo Leon, Mexico and came to the US with his family at two months of age. Cano entered military service in 1943 and was assigned to the 4th Infantry Division. He participated in the Normandy Landings and fought at Hürtgen Forest where his actions and extraordinary courage were recognized with the Medal of Honor. He also was awarded the Purple Heart, two Bronze Stars. He worked for years to become an American Citizen and finally achieved this in 1946.

Artifact of the Month: Sammy Rhea's Flag.

We have many flags but this one was probably the first captured by ground forces in Germany. Sammy Rhea of the $377^{\rm th}$ AAA (AW) Bn of the $4^{\rm th}$ Infantry Division crossed the Sigfried Line on September 13, 1944, near St. Vith, Belgium and brought this flag back.
